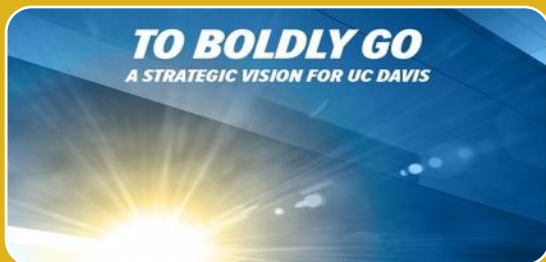

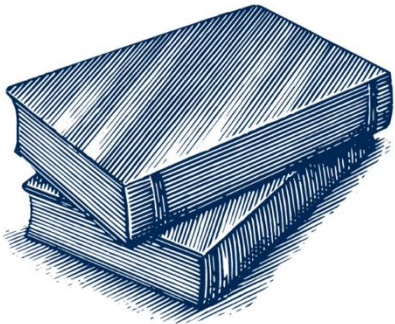

Global Strategies

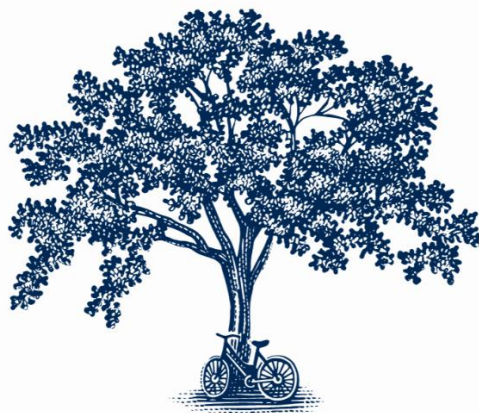
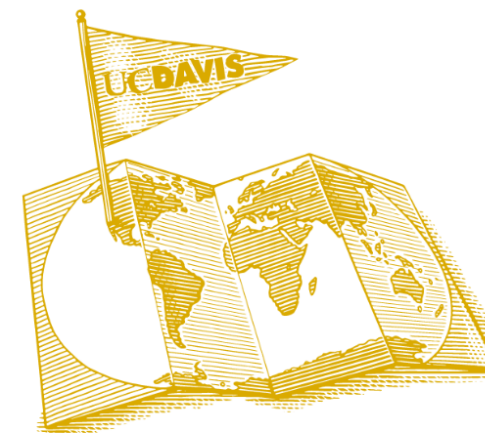


Partnership Considerations

-  **Thematic Priorities** Guiding challenge, purpose, or theme for the collaboration
-  **Reciprocity** Clear value propositions for both partners, mutual benefit
-  **Collaborative Advantage** Outcomes that could not be reached independently
-  **Relationships** Faculty champions, level of interest and energy, support from key stakeholders
-  **Readiness** Institutional capacity, resources

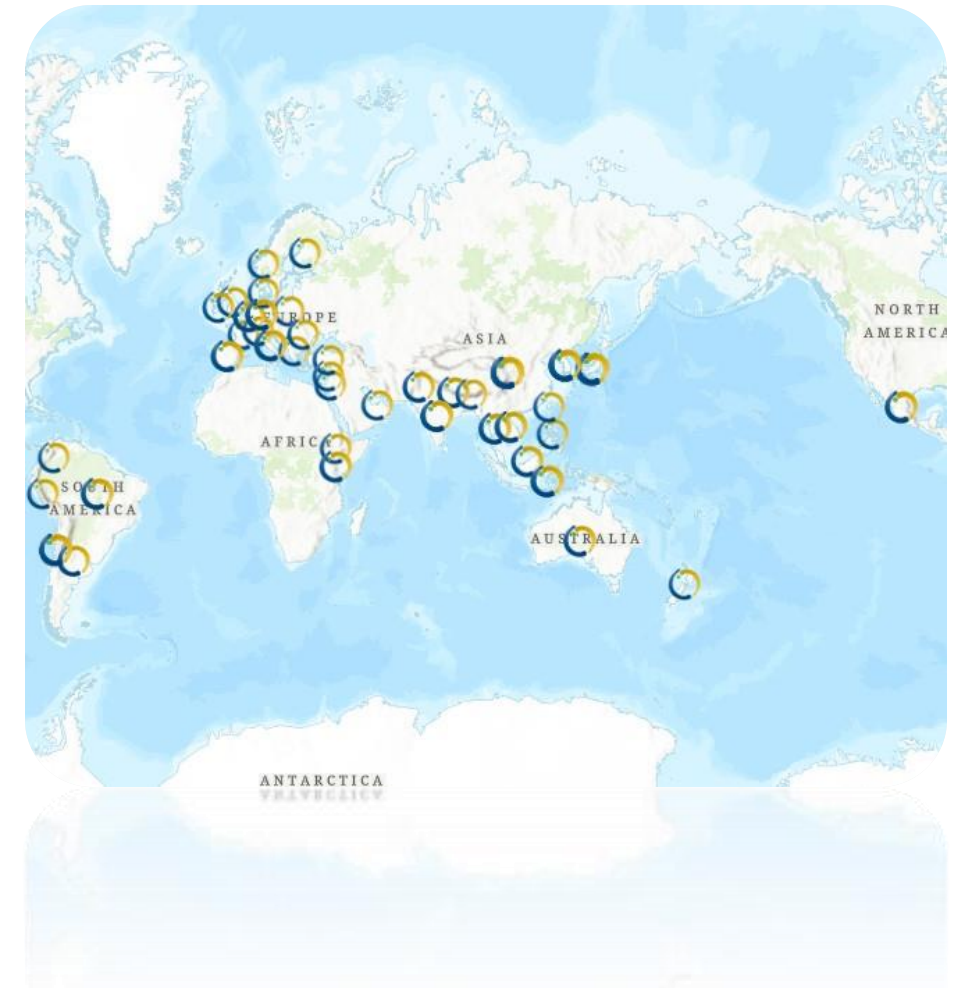

Moving beyond traditional bilateral
agreements requires the involvement
of **different stakeholders**



Proposal & Approval Process

- A **Faculty Champion** is required for all agreement requests.
- **Agreements of Cooperation (AOCs)** general, non-binding campus-level MOUs for the university to collaborate or cooperate.
- **Memoranda of Understanding (MOUs)** general, non-binding statements of mutual interest at the unit or program-level to explore collaboration opportunities.

INTERNATIONAL PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENTS PROPOSAL AND APPROVAL PROCESS

Check for current agreements by emailing globalaffairs@ucdavis.edu.

2 
Complete and submit a proposal request form, including required signatures.

3 
Global Affairs will review the proposal form and email an approved agreement template.

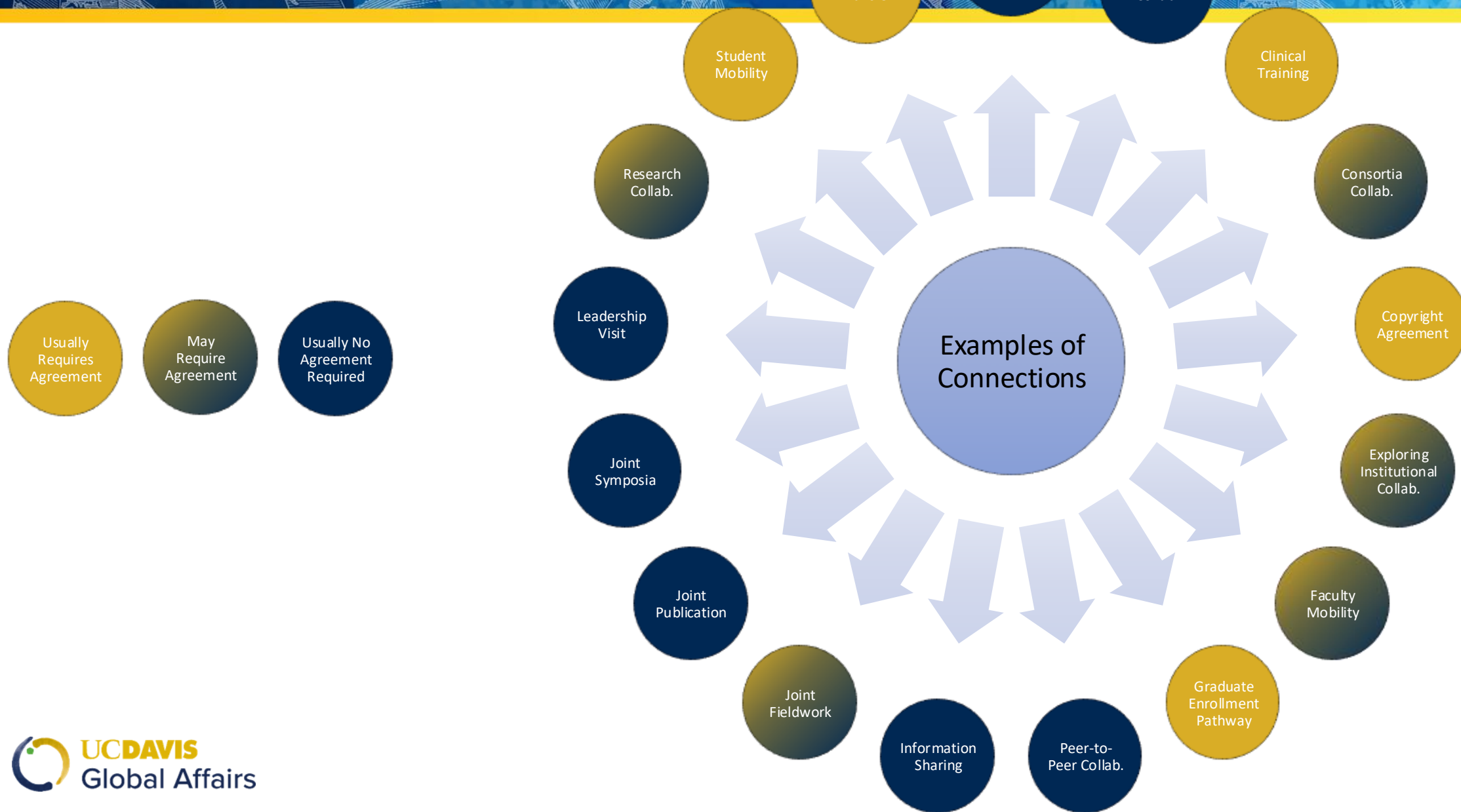

Upon agreement consensus, authorized signatories will sign the partnership agreement.

Statement of Contributions to Public and Global Impact

“Faculty scholarship includes engaging locally, regionally, nationally, and internationally, but the full breadth and impact of that work is not always appreciated or easily understood by those who evaluate their merit and promotion dossiers. It is important to understand, visualize, and evaluate the scope of faculty activities that fall under these cross-cutting and high-priority areas for the university.”

Why document public and global impact *intentionally* and *systematically* using this new statement?

Think beyond “service”

Explain the *full impact* of activities across research, teaching, and service

Make that impact legible to reviewers at all levels

Seed Grants

- Applications must be initiated by the UC Davis Principal Investigator
- Applications are received from Oct. to Dec.
- Total budget could be as much as \$20,000 (US) for work to be carried out over a period of up to two years
- Budget must follow existing UC policies (No salary for UC employees)
- UC Davis faculty members of Academic Senate or Academic Federation with PI status are eligible to apply



Seed Grants Impact

- \$4 million+ in grants have **generated \$50 million+** in external funding
- **290+** diverse projects
- **300+** UC Davis faculty in **80+** countries
- Support faculty from **every college and school**
- **Matching collaboration** between Global Affairs, academic deans, Diversity, Equity and Inclusion and the Office of Research



SDG Grants

- Applications must be initiated by the UC Davis Principal Investigator
- Applications are received from Oct. to Jan.
- Total budget could be as much as \$7,500 (US) for work to be carried out over a period of up to two years
- Budget must follow existing UC policies (No salary for UC employees)
- UC Davis faculty members of Academic Senate or Academic Federation with PI status are eligible to apply
- **Proposals must address specific UN SDGs**

SDG Grants Impact

- **\$200,000+** in grants
- **30** diverse projects
- **50+** UC Davis faculty
- Advance **all 17** SDGs
- **20+** partners in Oceania, Africa, Latin America, Europe, Middle East, Asia, and North America, including working with local diaspora communities on global issues

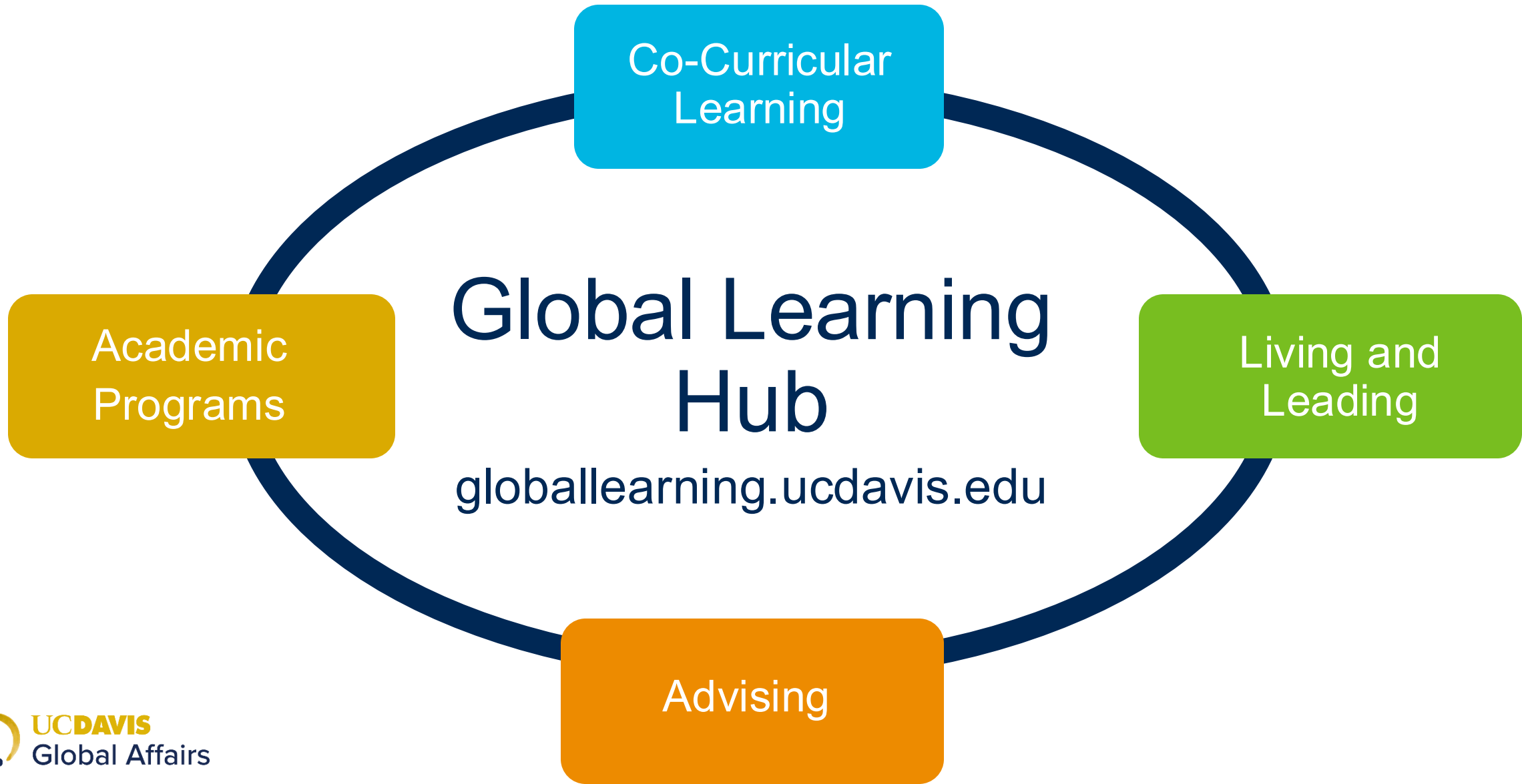

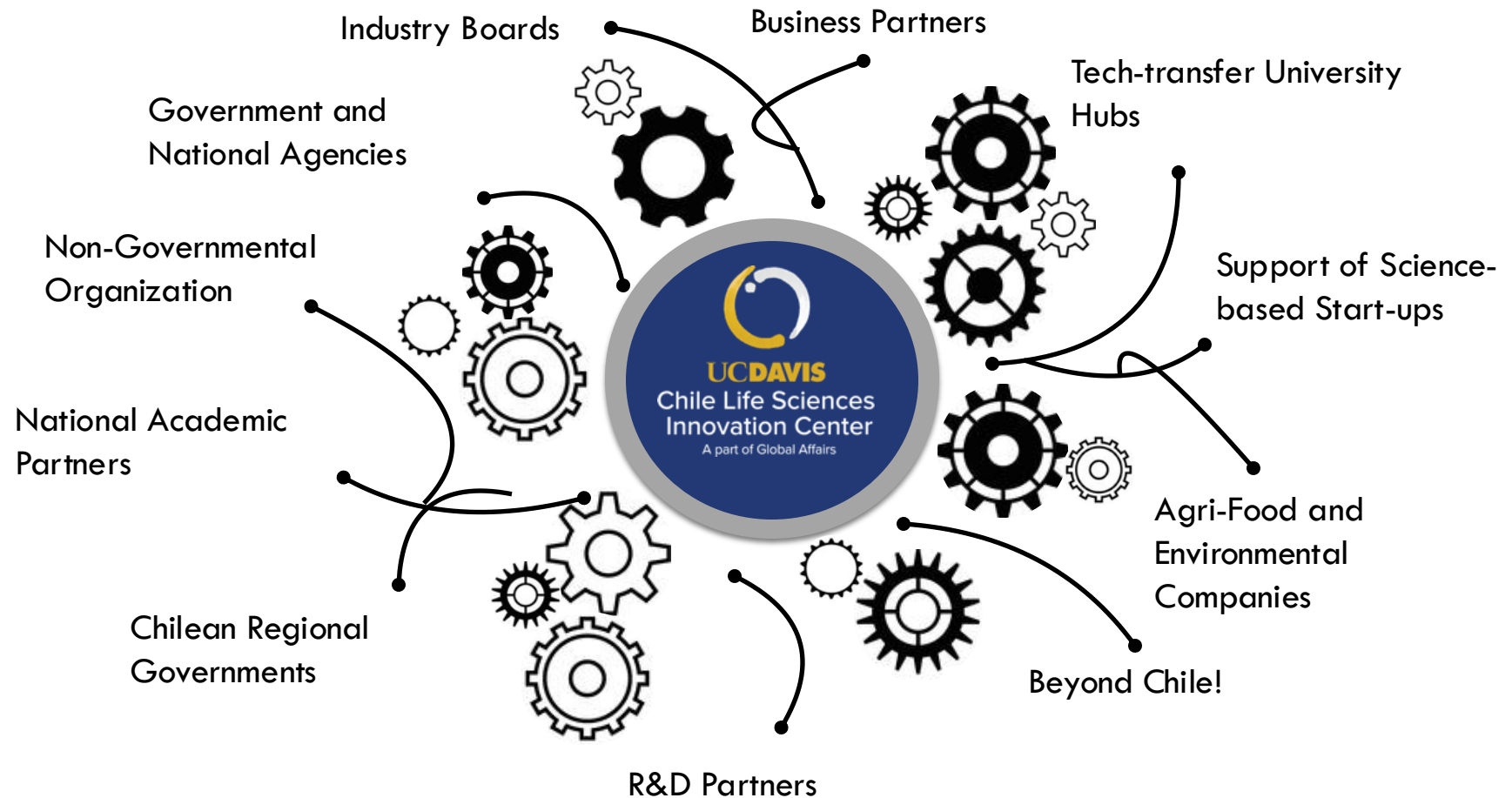

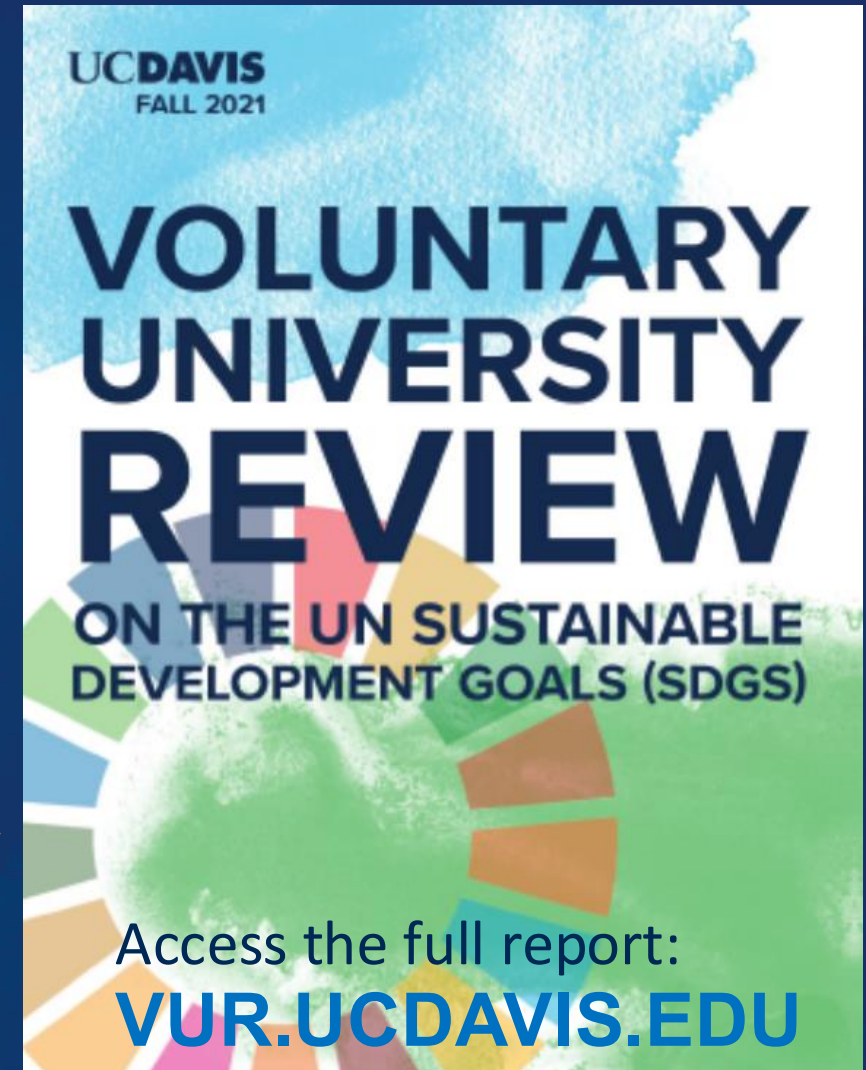

UC Davis Voluntary University Review

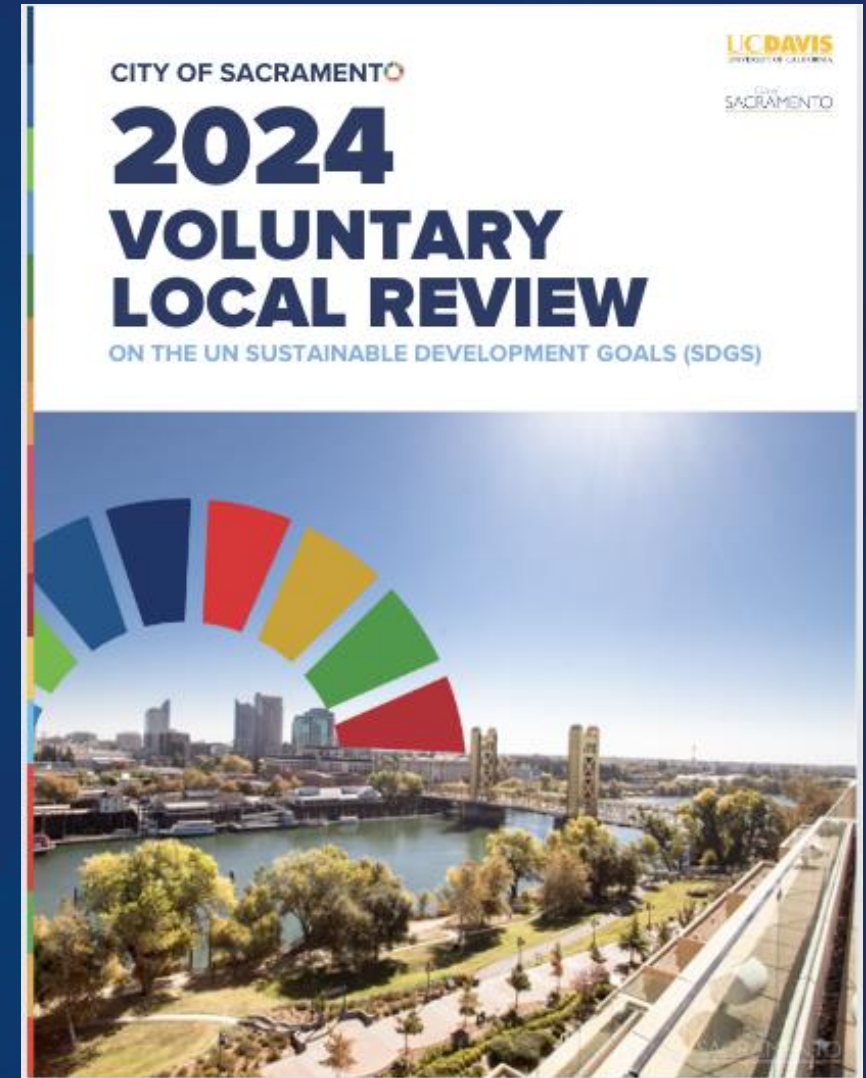
- One of the first VURs in the world, 2nd in the U.S.

Voluntary Local Review

- Released in Fall 2024.
