



A New Fellowship Program Launched by Graduate Studies for 2014-15

MENTORING AT CRITICAL TRANSITIONS (MCT) FELLOWSHIP with generous support from the Wakeham Fund

Now entering its fifth year, UC Davis'

Mentoring at Critical Transitions—a Faculty Development Program
is pleased to announce a new, competitive awards program for participating faculty.

Up to **five \$10,000 fellowships** will be awarded for faculty mentors to help support one or more of their graduate student mentees.

The general parameters of this competitive fellowship program are as follows. More specific guidelines are posted at: http://gradstudies.ucdavis.edu/faculty-staff/mentoring-critical-transitions

- To be eligible to apply, faculty must attend at least three of the five MCT workshops or panels offered during the academic year of 2014-2015.
- Eligible faculty who wish to enter the competition must submit a proposal, written with their mentee(s), showing how the mentor-mentee relationship can be enhanced. Proposals may address some of the skills or concepts shared from the MCT workshops or any other concepts that will contribute to their graduate students' professional development and successful and timely completion of their degree objective.
- Proposals will be due at the end of spring quarter 2015, on June 30, 2015.
- These proposals will be reviewed by a panel of faculty and graduate students, and five winners will be selected.
- The faculty winners will each receive \$10,000 that they will award as fellowships to one or more of their graduate student mentees to promote the latter's research and/or writing efforts. Funds will be available to award to graduate student mentees for the 2015-2016 academic year.
- The winning faculty will be recognized with a plaque for excellence in mentoring, and will be given an opportunity to present their project.
