

Facilitate equal opportunity and full participation in UCD services, programs, & activities




The presence of disability is an expression of human diversity

Currently, the SDC serves about 5.25% of UCD's total enrollment of 35,186, or 1,848 students


Create a welcoming office and community, facilitate equal access to academic services, programs, & activities


Protect academic rigor & technical standards, serve as an informational & consultation resource

Inclusion & Universal Design



You never know what you are capable of, until you are given no other choice.

Physical Environment: Ramps, curb cuts, door buttons, elevators & low buttons, wide doorways, accessible sinks, flexible seating

Educational Environment: multiple modes of communication (visual, audio, touch), audio books, assessment options (paper, exam, take home exam, group work, individual work), captioning

Programming: Participation flexibility, space to step away, permission to opt out of non essential activities

Campus Living: Let the student know that you're genuinely interested in connecting with them – but don't push. If a student discloses a disability, refer them to the Student Disability Center

- Increasing number of students disclosing disability and seeking accommodation
- Fastest growing group of students requesting accommodation report complex psychological disabilities
- Significant uptick in the number of students who with Autism seeking a college degree






Tips for Advisors, Instructors, & Staff

- Students may not realize that they may qualify for services through the SDC
- Students may become eligible for services at any point during the academic year
- Assume that students will use all of the services outlined in their Letter of Accommodation
- Students may require accommodation services beyond the classroom such as when working with Housing, Advising, Tutoring Services, OSSJA, ..
- Disability information is confidential, shared on a "need to know" basis only, and does not appear on transcripts or diplomas


