Shared Governance: The Cornerstone of the UC System

Academic Senate Duties and Powers (Regents Bylaw 40.1):

- Determine conditions for admission and for certificates and degrees
- Authorize and supervise all courses and curricula
- Advise the president and chancellors on campus and university budgets, and on the administration of libraries
- Advise on faculty appointments, merits, and promotions
- In practice, advise the administration on many additional issues that affect the conduct and welfare of the university
